We've had the pleasure of teaching Ms. Berge in the management specialization at the Stockholm School of Economics during the fall of 2017. The course focused on teaching students concrete analytical tools in the areas of operations management, consulting and change management and practice key management skills such as team work, presentation skills and analytical skills.

Throughout the course and its many practical and theoretical assignments, we were impressed by Ms. Berge's consistent top results, demonstrating an excellent aptitude for the subjects taught. With a thorough theoretical and practical understanding of change- and operations management, Ms. Berge attained a total score of 97/100, and by that achieved the highest grade of all the over 50 students in the specialization. It is clear that she is an extremely bright, ambitious and hard-working student.

A major part of the specialization is a real-life consultancy project, in which the students work with actual organizations to analyze and solve an operations-related problem, and subsequently lay out an implementation plan. Ms. Berge's team performed extremely well and delivered a consultancy report with a very high level of professionalism, exceeding client as well as academic expectations.

The students also practice case cracking, in which they are judged on their analytical ability, presentation skills and slide design. During these assignments, Ms. Berge proved that she has very strong analytical skills and a talent for graphical design, using visuals, figures, and designs in an exemplary way to clarify and summarize ideas and information. Ms. Berge's team delivered solutions that were awarded top grades and also won a case cracking competition hosted by Arkwright consulting.

Ms. Berge showed a genuine engagement and interest throughout the specialization, actively contributing to class discussions and being a resource to her fellow students. It was a real pleasure to teach Ms. Berge, and it is our strong belief that she is exceptionally well equipped for continuing her studies or pursuing a career in the field of management.
