Director's statement

By Pablo Lamar

La última tierra (Last Land) is a film about the echoes of death resonating within life.

I wanted to portray the mood of the main character as he experiences the loss of his companion. Through this process of letting go, he begins to recognize himself without her.

We accompany him as he is impacted by a heightened perception of time. Reflecting the presence of everything that surrounds him, the film takes on the tone of an intimate ritual.

Producer's statement

By Ilse Hughan

I am a 'follower' of the French Master filmmaker Robert Bresson. So when I met Pablo Lamar during a workshop for young Latin American filmmakers, I was intrigued by his proposal since it is exactly what I am interested in: a filmmaker with a voice of his own, looking for a way to tell a story with images and not with words.

Also I was very impressed by his previous work, the short film *Ahendu nde sapukai* (I Hear Your Scream). It is the perfect example of what you can do with film: no dialogues, just one scene that shows and tells something very universal and understandable. Less is more. That seems easy, but it is not, on the contrary it asks for a lot of creativity and courage.

And that's what Pablo did in *La última tierra*, cutting the 'flesh of the bones' so only the essential has been left, the essence of what he wants to communicate. Also 'time' is an important part of this approach, the duration of the scenes.

Biographies

Ramón del Río, actor

Born in Asunción, Paraguay in 1941, Ramón Del Río is one of the most talented Paraguayan theatre and movie actors. Building a rich career, he performed on stage in over one hundred plays. In 1982 he made his film acting début in the Brazilian movie *Noites Paraguaias* directed by Aloysio Raulino. Since then he acted in several other feature and short films, notably in internationally acclaimed *Hamaca paraguaya (Paraguayan Hammock)* by Paz Encina (2006) which was awarded the Prix FIPRESCI of the Un Certain Regard section at the Festival de Cannes.



Vera Valdez Barreto, actress

Legendary Brazilian model and actress Vera Valdez was just 17 years old when she was hired in Paris for Gabrielle 'Coco' Chanel's come-back show in 1954. Valdez became Chanel's favorite model, returned to Brasil, was imprisoned during the military dictatorship period and, helped by filmmakers Louis Malle and Bernardo Bertolucci, left the country again to live in exile. Currently residing in São Paolo, Vera Valdez performs on stage at Teatro Oficina, the experimental theatre company led by José Celso. (Photo by Fernanda Negrini)





He also works as a sound designer for film.


Pablo Lamar's La última tierra (Last Land) marks Sapukai Cine's first feature-film production.

Fortuna Films I Netherlands

Fortuna Films was founded by Ilse Hughan as an Amsterdam based distribution and sales company for documentary films for well-known documentary filmmakers such as Heddy Honigmann, Andreas Hoessli, Peter Liechti and Johan van der Keuken.

In 2002 Fortuna Films moved into production focusing on both development and production of independent filmmaking in Latin America.

Ilse Hughan studied at the University of Ámsterdam (Literature and Translation) and worked for years as a Dutch translator of French and Italian movies. In 1992 she brought new life to Fortuna Films, the film company her grandfather Jean Desmet founded in 1909. She is managing director of Fortuna Films in Amsterdam and vice-president of Fundación TyPA, a cultural foundation based in Buenos Aires, Argentina. She also works for the International Film Festival Rotterdam (IFFR) as a member of the selection committee of the Hubert Bals Fund and is co-founder and co-director of the Buenos Aires Lab (BAL), the co-production market for Latin American film projects within the framework of BAFICI (Buenos Aires International Film Festival).



Fortuna Films co-produced a.o. *Los muertos* (2004), *Fantasma* (2006), *Liverpool* (2008) and *Jauja* (2014) by Lisandro Alonso and *Hamaca Paraguaya* (2006) by Paz Encina. All 5 films have been selected for the Festival de Cannes respectively in the sections Quinzaine des Réalisateurs and Un Certain Regard. In 2014 *Jauja* was awarded the Prix FIPRESCI of the Un Certain Regard section at the Festival de Cannes.

Fortuna Films was associated producer of *Abrir puertas y ventanas* (*Back to Stay*) by Milagros Mumenthaler (Golden Leopard, Festival del Filme di Locarno 2011) and *Dos disparos* (2014) by Martin Rejtman.

Fortuna will be presenting at IFFR 2016 *La última tierra* (*Last Land*) by Pablo Lamar (Paraguay) in the Hivos Tiger Awards Competition and is currently in pre pre production of *Eureka* (working title) by Lisandro Alonso.
