Eurotunnel helps Saint Thérèse across the Channel

On Tuesday, September the 15th 2009, the relics of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux travelled from Calais to Folkestone on a Eurotunnel Passenger shuttle.

At 15:50 French Time a specially adapted vehicle containing the holy relics boarded a Eurotunnel Passenger Shuttle in Calais and arrived 35 minutes later (15:25 UK Time) in Folkestone, UK.

A delegation of eight people, including Father Keith Barltrop, coordinator of the relics' tour of England and Wales, Sister Marie-Christine of the Carmelite Community in Lisieux and a filmmaker accompanied the vehicle. Saint Thérèse and her party were met on the platform in Folkestone by Eurotunnel management and local press.

Although these important relics have travelled the world, they have never before visited the UK. They will go on tour around England and Wales for a month before heading back to France through the Channel Tunnel on October 16th.

Famous Jaguars to be displayed at Eurotunnel tomorrow

On Thursday September the 24th 2009, four fabulous classic cars from Jaguar Heritage will travel with Eurotunnel to attend "Le 3eme week-end de l'Excellence Automobile de Reims".

At 3 pm, Jaguar Heritage will display the four unique Jaguars at Eurotunnel's Passenger Terminal in Folkestone for an hour, before loading them into a Shuttle bound for France.

Eurotunnel customers and journalists will be able to admire and take pictures of the Jaguar C type, the Jaguar XJR9, the Jaguar long nose D type and the Jaguar short nose D type.

They have all triumphed at famous French circuits:

The short nose D type won the 24 hours of Le Mans three years in a row from 1955 to 1957, the long nose D type finished first at the Reims 12-hours in 1956, the C type won the 24 Hours of Le Mans twice in 1951 and 1953, the XJR9 succeeded in the same competition more recently in 1988.

Eurotunnel is co-sponsor of the Reims Circuit event occurring from September the 25th to September the 27th and will keep the 1954 Short nose D Type Jaguar on display in its Passenger Terminal Building for the duration of the event.
