NARRATIVE TRAINING REPORT

Aircraft Handling

Jean-Michel's aircraft handling is good. He uses a light touch on the controls combined with the correct attitude selection and trimming techniques to achieve a high standard of accuracy. His landings were consistent and well controlled as were his unusual attitude recoveries and stalling.

Instrument Flying

Jean-Michel's instrument flying was of a high standard. His scan was consistent and he was achieving a good standard of accuracy from the early stages of the course. He has a good understanding of applied instrument flying and his NDB work developed to a good standard.

Navigation

Jean-Michel is a sound navigator. While he planned each navigation trip thoroughly and showed sensible cockpit management skills he maintained a flexible approach which enabled him to adapt to changing circumstances with ease. His situational awareness was satisfactory and he made best used of the resources available to him.

Airmanship

Jean-Michel has a good grasp of Airmanship, making sensible and sound decisions when faced with a choice of priorities. His preparation for flight was thorough and professional and due consideration had been given to all the potential issues for the flight.

Capacity

Throughout the course Jean-Michel showed he had the capacity required for single pilot IFR work. He is quick to learn and should have no problems moving to a more complex type.
